Our Pandemic Experience

As the COVID-19 pandemic has evolved this year, our team has worked hard to live infection prevention and control practices each and every day. Together, we have continued to navigate this time with guidance from our pandemic plan; information from Public Health; and advice from Nova Scotia's Chief Medical Officer.

Throughout this experience, we've reflected often on the value that family members have always brought to life at The Birches, and to their loved ones who reside here. Our team has worked hard to create opportunity for families to connect with residents. Indoor visits, window visits, virtual visits, and phone calls have been bright spots for residents. In September, we were able to welcome Designated Caregivers back in to our facility, and they have made an amazing difference!

In late 2020, we were thrilled to begin offering biweekly COVID-19 serial testing at the Birches for members of our team. The purpose of serial testing is to identify asymptomatic individuals. It is thought that asymptomatic spread has contributed to outbreaks of COVID-19 in other long term care homes, so serial testing is an important step to keep our residents safe. We are proud of our team for embracing serial testing this year!



We were also thrilled to be able to rollout COVID-19 vaccination for both Birches residents and staff members this year. This news was very hopeful for many, including residents who are eager for signs that life may eventually return to normal.

We are hopeful for calmer days ahead as well. But whatever the future holds, our team continues to strive to support our residents, families, volunteers and colleagues; and to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

A Home-Like Environment — Baby Dolls and Furry Friends

Pets are a wonderful addition to long term care homes. They can fill seniors with feel-good endorphins, alleviate loneliness, give seniors a sense of purpose, and provide an opportunity for fun and play! Doll Therapy also offers a lot of these same benefits — a doll can often decrease stress and agitation, and offer comfort and companionship. They also offer an opportunity for caring and structure.
